SUBJECT: Narcan Inventory and Assessment

During the Health and Hospital Committee Meeting on January 19, 2022 (Item No. 8), Supervisor Simitian requested that the Behavioral Health Services Department (BHSD) provide an off-agenda memo on the inventory and assessment of the distribution of Narcan kits, including where they are accessible and currently where they are not available, but should be.

## Narcan Training and Distribution to First Responders

The Santa Clara County Opioid Overdose Prevention Project (SCCOOPP) leads the efforts in prevention, education and treatment accessibility for community members that are struggling with opioid addiction. As part of its prevention efforts, the coalition's goal has been to educate, train and provide Naloxone (Narcan) kits to the community to save a life from opioid overdose. Narcan kits are designed to help reverse opioid overdose. SCCOOPP started its Narcan education and distribution effort with the County's law enforcement partners in June 2017. In addition, first responders in Santa Clara County (County) were provided Narcan kits and trained to administer them. In the County, all Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) and fire departments carry and have been trained to administer the Narcan kits. SCCOOPP has been providing Narcan trainings and has distributed approximately 3,900 Narcan kits to the various law enforcement agencies and court departments. Below is the list of law enforcement agencies and court departments that have been trained and provided Narcan kits.

## Narcan Training and Distribution at Schools

SCCOOP has provided outreach and education on the effectiveness of Narcan kits in cases of opioid overdoses to school districts, colleges and universities through a County-wide education and awareness campaign. All colleges and universities in Santa Clara County have been trained and provided with Narcan kits. SCCOOPP in collaboration with Santa Clara County Office of Education has developed an opioid education curriculum for high schools and is working with interested school districts to make this available for students. The COVID-19 pandemic slowed the efforts on the school districts, but SCCOOPP has been continuing efforts to reach out to the school districts to embrace Narcan kits as an important prevention tool given the continued incidences of opioid overdoses in the school age population. ## Community Narcan Training and Distribution

SCCOOPP provides Narcan kits and training to the public every day from 1:00-2:00pm at three County clinic locations (i.e., Central Valley, Alexian Health, and South County). Aside from the daily scheduled time, individuals can also walk-in and be provided with a Narcan kit during business hours at any of the three listed clinics. The Valley Homeless Healthcare Program (VHHP) and In-Home Outreach Team (IHOT) have also been trained and equipped with Narcan kits. Outreach, training and distribution were delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but SCCOOP will continue to broaden their outreach to the community in places such as shelters and other clinics during the Summer of 2022.
